Appalachian Fair's General Rules & Regulations

To ensure a safe, fun, family-friendly environment, the Appalachian Fair implements these rules and regulations for having the best experience possible! 🌻 🎵 🐾

Entry & Security

-  All items brought onto the fairgrounds are subject to search by security personnel.
-  The Appalachian Fair reserves the right to deny entry to any person or item deemed unsafe by Appalachian Fair Security Officials or the Washington County Sheriff's Department.

Prohibited & Restricted Items

-  Selfie sticks
-  Backpacks (discouraged)
-  Firearms or weapons of any kind
-  Outside food & beverages (including coolers) – *Exceptions may be made for guests with special dietary needs, baby food, or infant formula*
-  Alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs
-  Tobacco products – *discouraged and strictly not allowed in barns or seating areas*
-  Umbrellas – *not allowed in concert or seating areas*
-  Camping/tailgating chairs – not allowed
-  Pets – *not permitted at any time unless part of an authorized show/exhibit. Only trained service dogs assisting guests with disabilities are permitted. Service animals must remain under control, on a leash or harness at all times.*
-  Drones/motorized aircraft systems – prohibited above or near the fairgrounds unless prior permission is obtained from fair management, in accordance with FAA regulations.

Weather Policy

-  The Appalachian Fair is a rain or shine event, including all concerts and attractions.
-  No rainchecks or refunds will be issued.
-  Severe weather warnings within 5 miles (as issued by the National Weather Service) will trigger immediate public address or media announcements directing guests to seek shelter.
-  Designated shelters: Farm & Home Building ♦ Building 1 ♦ Building 3 ♦ Building 4 ♦ Appalachian Heritage Museum ♦ Show Barn
-  Concerts or events may be delayed, postponed, or canceled depending on severity and duration of weather.

Conduct & Attire

-  Shirt and shoes are required at all times.
-  Appropriate, family-friendly attire is expected.
-  Open-toed shoes are not permitted on certain rides (*see Drew Exposition ride requirements online*).
-  Guests displaying inappropriate or disruptive behavior will be removed from the fairgrounds.

Soliciting & Promotions

-  Unauthorized soliciting, selling, distribution of materials, or promotion of other events/organizations is strictly prohibited.
-  Unauthorized posting of signs, banners, or handbills is not allowed on the grounds, parking areas, or fencing.
-  All sales and promotional activities must be pre-approved by Appalachian Fair Management.

Admission, Tickets & Re-Entry

-  No re-entry: Hand stamps are not used. Guests must purchase a new ticket to re-enter once leaving.
-  Tickets must be purchased **only** through the **Appalachian Fair website** or the **official Box Office**. *Third-party tickets are not guaranteed* and will not be honored. *Scammers charging more than our advertised prices (\$10-\$25) should be avoided.*
-  Lost or stolen tickets are the responsibility of the purchaser.
-  All tickets, coupons, and passes become void after the last day of the event.

Safety & Liability

-  The Appalachian Fair and Washington County Sheriff's Office encourage parents to photograph their child/children before entering, in case of separation.
-  Washington County EMS provides on-site emergency medical services.  First Aid is located beside the **Appalachian Heritage Museum and Appalachian Arena**.
-  The Appalachian Fair is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items.
-  All property, merchandise, or exhibits are left at the fairgrounds at the sole risk of the owner.
-  By entering the fairgrounds, guests assume the inherent risks of exposure to E-Coli/Salmonella (animal areas) and COVID-19 (public gathering).  We encourage frequent *washing or sanitizing of your hands*, especially after visiting animal exhibits. Hand-washing stations and hand-sanitizer units are available throughout the grounds.

Appalachian Fair Scholarship Program

The **Appalachian Fair** proudly awards a **minimum of two (2) \$1,000 scholarships** each year to deserving students selected by the Scholarship Committee.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be a **permanent resident** of the area served by the Appalachian Fair.
- Must be either a **high school senior or currently enrolled** in a college, university, or accredited vocational school.
- Must have a **minimum GPA** of 2.5.
- Must have **participated** in the **Appalachian Fair** within the past **two (2) years**.

🏷️ Entry Tags

- Pre-registered exhibitors may **pick up entry tags in advance** from the Fair Office.
- Attach tags in the **upper right-hand corner** of each item before drop-off.
- Walk-in entries will be accepted on department entry days; however, **pre-registration is strongly encouraged** to help with pre-fair setup and scheduling!

📦 Entry Removal

- This is a **ONE-DAY-ONLY** pickup window for each program area.

Eligibility

- Exhibitors must be **current members** of the youth organizations represented by each department.



Exhibit Rules

- 🎨 Entries must be **original** and completed within the **past 12 months**, unless otherwise stated.
- Each individual exhibitor may enter ➡ **one (1) item per lot**.
- **School Groups** ➡ Up to **three (3) entries per lot** (check with Department Director if more are needed)
- Items must be **clean, new, and undamaged**; completed within the past 12 months (unless otherwise stated.)
- 🔥 No items containing **flammable liquids**.
- 🌿 **Horticulture, Field Crops, and Floral** items must be **grown by the exhibitor** and produced during the current year.
- 🚫 Previously entered items are **not eligible** for re-entry.



Judging & Awards

- 🏆 Judges will not award premiums to entries deemed unworthy of recognition, even if unopposed in a class.
- Only authorized staff may be present during judging evaluations.
- 💰 Premium checks will be distributed on pick-up day (if available) or mailed afterward.

🚫 Disqualifications

- ⚖️ The Appalachian Fair may **disqualify any exhibitor** who interferes with judges, clerks, or ribbon placement.

Premium Payments

- Premium checks will be distributed on pick-up day when possible; otherwise, mailed to the exhibitor's address. Please ensure all contact information is accurate.
- Teachers/clubs may register entries under the class name to receive a combined check.
- Premium checks must be **cashed or deposited within 90 days**. All unclaimed premiums by **December 31, 2026** are **forfeited** to the Appalachian Fair Association.

Display Limitations

- Items that cannot be safely or appropriately displayed may be refused unless pre-approved by the Youth Department Manager. **Suggested Maximum display size:** 60 inches in any direction.

HOW TO SUBMIT AN ONLINE ENTRY

- Visit our website: www.appalachianfair.com
- Go to the Department page and scroll down to select ‘Submit On-line Entries Here’
- Choose the type of entry you are submitting - *Farm & Home, Livestock, or Youth.*
- Log in or create a new account by following these steps:
 - Click the **Register** button
 - Create your **Exhibitor ID or Username** (6-20 characters)
 - Create your **Password** (3-15 characters)
 - Enter a **Security Word** to help you remember your log-in ID
 - Enter your **name, address, phone number, and email address** – please complete all fields!
 - Be sure your mailing address is correct; **premium checks will be mailed to this address.**
- Submit your entries
- Click the ‘Add New Exhibit’ link
- Choose the department and class you are entering
- For Youth entries submitted by a teacher or class:
 - **Last Name:** School name (e.g., *Appalachian Fair HS*)
 - **First Name:** Teacher’s name or blank
 - When the **Teacher’s name** is listed as **First Name**, both the school and teacher’s names will be listed as the payee on premium checks.
 - If desired, the **first name field may be left blank** and the teacher/class/student’s name listed in the first line of the address.
- For Livestock entries:
 - Provide additional details such as **breed, birthdate, animal name, registration number**, etc.
 - For other entries, simply choose the lot being entered.
- Confirm that your entry information is correct.
- Submit additional entries as needed – a list of all entries will be displayed.
- When finished, click “Checkout.”
- If an entry fee is required (Livestock entries only):
 - An **invoice** will be **emailed** to you for payment by **credit card or e-transfer.**
 - **Livestock exhibitors** may also request **exhibitor passes.**
 - Payments not received by **midnight on August 3** will incur **late fees (double entry fee pricing).**
- You will receive an **email confirmation** within **48 hours** of submission.

This contest is held in conjunction with “Tennessee’s Fairest of the Fair” Contest, which is sponsored by the Tennessee Association of Fairs.



FAIREST OF THE FAIR RULES & INFORMATION:

- **Entry Fee & Sponsorship:**
 - A **\$50 NON-REFUNDABLE ENTRY FEE** is required for each Contestant.
 - Each contestant must be sponsored by a civic organization, business, or family member.
 - Entry forms are available from the Appalachian Fair Office or may be downloaded from www.appalachianfair.com . Completed entries must be delivered to the Fair Office no later than August 13.
 - The number of contestants is limited to 30.
 - Payment may be made by check, cash, or credit card. Checks should be made payable to the Appalachian Fair.
- **Eligibility Requirements:** Contestants must be residents of Tennessee. An original birth certificate must be presented at the first rehearsal as all contestants must have reached their 16th birthday but not their 21st birthday on or before December 31 of the current year.
- **Judging Criteria:** Contestants will be judged on the following: Beauty – Poise – Personality.
- **Contest Details:** The Fairest of the Fair Pageant will be held at the Appalachian Fairgrounds on Monday, August 24, 2026, at 7:00pm on the Museum Stage. The contestant crowned Fairest of the Fair must be available to reign for the remainder of the week of the Fair, assisting with all pageant competitions and other Fair events as requested by Fair management. Additional rules and expectations are detailed on the official application form.
- **Disqualifications & Conduct:** Contestants are not eligible if they have ever been married, have had a child, competed in a prior Tennessee Association of Fair (TAF) State Pageant, or been convicted of a felony. All contestants must be of good moral character and must be, and have always been, of the female gender.
- **Attire Requirements:** Contestants must wear formal floor-length attire. Dresses may be two pieces but cannot consist of a wrap-skirt worn over a bodysuit. A modest midriff may be visible; however, bralettes are not appropriate. Contestants should dress age-appropriately for the 16-20 age group.
- **State Competition Eligibility:** Additional rules and eligibility requirements are established by the Tennessee Association of Fairs Pageant Committee for participation in the TAF Fairest of the Fair State Pageant. Please refer to the official application form for the complete list of state-level regulations.
- **Awards & Honors:** The young lady crowned Appalachian Fair’s Fairest of the Fair will receive a \$2,500 scholarship award, payable the following year upon the crowning of the 2026 Fairest of the Fair. Proof of school registration must be submitted to receive the scholarship award. The Fairest of the Fair will also represent the Appalachian Fair in the Tennessee Fairest of the Fair Contest held in Murfreesboro in January 2027. The Appalachian Fair will cover all travel expenses for the queen and her chaperone to attend the state competition.
- **State Competition Winner:** The winner of the state contest will receive the title of ‘Tennessee’s Fairest of the Fair’ and such prizes as approved by the Tennessee Association of Fairs.

LITTLE MISS PAGEANT RULES & INFORMATION:

- **Entry Fee:** Each contestant must pay a **\$50 non-refundable entry fee**. The fee must accompany the completed entry form. Accepted payments: Cash, check, or credit card. Faxed or emailed forms will receive an online payment invoice. Entry forms and payment must be received before the contestant will be added to the roster.
- **Awards:** A **Queen** and **four (4) Runners-Up** will be chosen in each division, each receiving a trophy. All other contestants will receive a participation trophy.
- **Age Divisions:**
 - Wee Miss (Division I): 2-3 years old (must be accompanied onstage by an adult)
 - Tiny Miss (Division II): 4-6 years old
 - Little Miss (Division III): 7-9 years old
 - Little Miss Pre-Teen (Division IV): 10-12 years old
 - Teen Miss (Division V): 13-15 years old
- **Attire:** Contestants must wear a dress of their choice. Exposed midriffs are not permitted.
- **Judging:** Contestants will be judged on: Beauty – 75%; Personality – 25%. Judges' score sheets will not be made available to contestant or family members.
- **Proof of Age:** The Appalachian Fair reserves the right to request proof of age for any contestant.
- **Guidelines:** All contestants must abide by the rules and guidelines set by the Pageant Committee.
- **Eligibility Restrictions:** First-place winners are not eligible to compete again in the same division. 2026 Queens must be present to crown the 2027 winners and therefore may not compete the following year. Age divisions are determined by the contestant's age on the day of the contest.

Photogenic Rules:

- **Purpose of Event:** The contest provides an opportunity for spectators to view people modeling wool garments while leading their wool-producing sheep, promoting both the animal and the value of wool products.
- **Judging Standards:** Contestants will be evaluated on the following:
 - **Contestant's Garment:** Suitability, practicality, and appropriateness for the contestant's age and maturity.
 - **Poise & Appearance:** Overall presentation including accessories, grooming, and make-up as appropriate for the contestant's age and garment style. Contestants should appear comfortable, confident, and wear their garments to best advantage.
 - **Control & Presentation of Lamb:** Ability to handle, lead, and display the animal effectively.
- **Entry Requirements:** Each entry must include a brief contestant biography and a description of the garment being modeled.

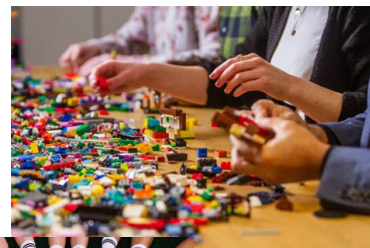

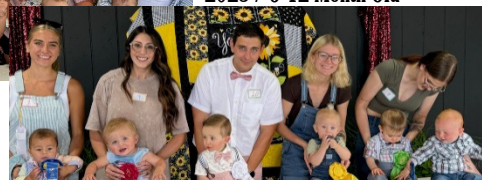

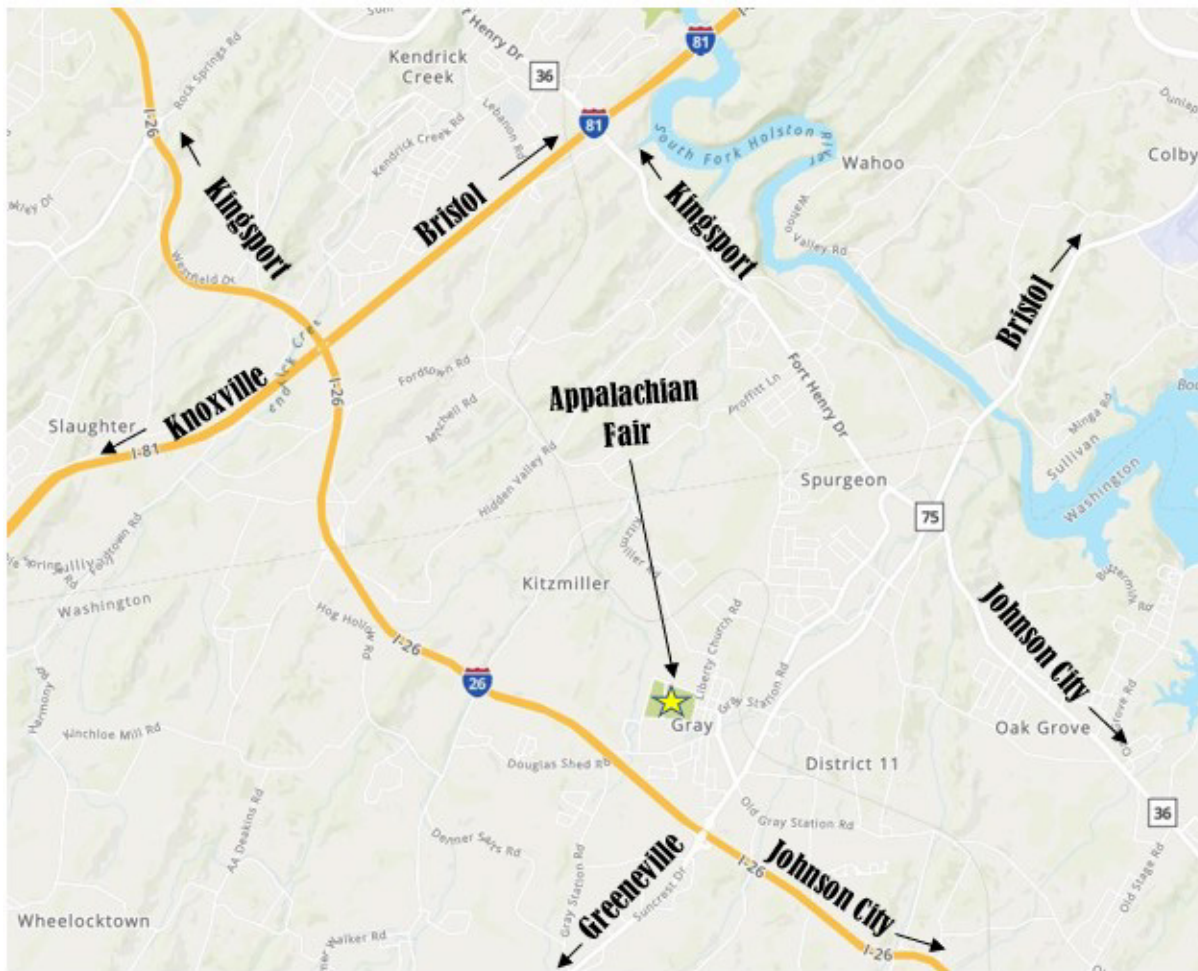
