APPALACHIAN FAIR YOUTH BOARD RULES & REGULATIONS



2026 Appalachian Fair ~ 100th Year ~ August 24th-29th, 2026

1. Age – Must be in at least the Eighth Grade and may <u>not</u> have reached their 21st birthday before or during the Fair week.

2. Applications – Application will be made to the Fair office and selections will be made by at least two adults, selected by the Fair Board of Directors. **Applicants must reapply**

each year.

- 3. Responsibilities Should be available to work during the week of the Fair and for 1 to 2 weeks prior to the Fair opening. Youth Board members should be prepared to volunteer to work for approximately 15-20 hours prior to and during the Fair. Most volunteer time will be in the evenings from 5-10pm. Volunteer time may include up to five (5) days and/or nights. Youth Board members should attend at least 75% of the meetings; either in person or virtual. Approximately four meetings are held each year. Please consider all extracurricular activities and the time they take when making your decision to apply for the Youth Board.
- 4. Youth Board members must serve at least one year before holding an office. If requested, officers are to attend the adult Fair Board meetings to report on their activities.
- 5. Youth Board members must follow all rules or be dismissed from the Youth Board.
- 6. Youth Board members in good standing will receive (1) full week pass, (1) full week companion pass, (1) full week parking pass, and two (2) reserved seat tickets to (2) concerts during the week of the fair.

NOTE: Any Youth Board member not meeting the requirements as listed above will not receive Fair passes, concert tickets, shirts, etc. and may be dismissed from the Youth Board.

Appalachian Fair Youth Board membership is a huge honor and responsibility and requires your dedication and commitment. Before applying, please talk with your family and decide together if this is something you would be able and willing to do.

Volunteer opportunities:

Hardee's Coupons: Greet fairgoers as they enter the gates and pass out coupons. Interact with the crowd, smile, and be pleasant. YOU'RE THE FIRST PERSON THEY SEE AS THEY ENTER THE FAIRGROUNDS. Make sure the gates have plenty of coupons available for the night.

Appy's Kitchen: Work with Board Members and volunteers serving guests at the fair concession booth.

Pick TN Products: Pass out samples when available to visitors at the booth. Answer questions regarding Tennessee products and agriculture.

Watermelon Eating Contest: Help with the set-up of tables, slicing the watermelons, and clean-up after the contest.

Stage Lights / Stage Help: Operate the spotlights for the events at the Museum Stage and assist where needed at the Museum Stage.

Appy: THE BEST JOB! Dance, wave, take photos, and give hugs and high-5s all evening! Be HAPPY!! Your Appy!

Appy's Farm: Oversee the play area, watch and help keep toys from 'disappearing' from the play area, sweep/clean-up around the soil and corn pits. Make sure everything is left clean and neat before closing each night.

4-H Building Helper: Greet visitors who visit the 4-H building. Water plants, if needed, and check for produce that needs to be discarded.

Photographer: Take lots of photos of the fair. Events, buildings, midway, barns, EVERYTHING! COVER IT ALL! These photos help us promote the fair.

FFA Building Set-up: Assist the FFA Building advisors in getting ready for the fair.

Farm & Home Building Set-up: Assist the Farm & Home directors in getting the building ready for the fair.

Other duties and tasks will be added as needed.
