CONTESTANT MUST BE AVAILABLE THE ENTIRE WEEK OF THE FAIR TO FULFILL ALL REQUIRED DUTIES

- 1. <u>Entry Requirements & Fee</u>: A \$50.00 NON-REFUNDABLE ENTRY FEE is required for each contestant. Each contestant must be sponsored by a civic organization, business, or family member. Entry forms may be obtained from the Appalachian Fair office, downloaded from the Fair website, requested by phone at 423.477.3211, or by e-mail at <u>appalachianfair@gmail.com</u>. Completed **typed and notarized** entry forms must be returned to the Appalachian Fair Office on or before **AUGUST 13**, along with the **\$50 fee**. Forms may be submitted:

If submitted by fax or e-mail, the entry fee must be paid online. An online invoice payable by credit card or echeck will be sent to the email address listed on the application. Checks should be made payable to the <u>Appalachian Fair</u>. All major credit cards will be accepted. The Appalachian Fair reserves the right to limit entries to **30 contestants**. **No entries or fees will be accepted after August 13**.

- 2. <u>Age & Residency</u>: Contestant must be 16-20 years of age, having reached their 16th birthday but not their 21st birthday by December 31 of the contest year. Contestants must be a residents of Tennessee. An original birth certificate must be presented at the first rehearsal.
- 3. <u>Judging Criteria:</u> Contestants will be judged on:
 - Beauty
 - Poise
 - Personality
- 4. Pageant & Reign Requirements: The contest will be held Monday, August 24, at 7:00PM on the Museum Stage at the Appalachian Fair. The winner must be available to serve and represent the Fair throughout the entire week of August 24-29, 2026. If the Appalachian Fair titleholder wins another title during her reign that prevents her from fulfilling her duties or wearing the Appalachian Fair crown and sash, she must relinquish her title and scholarship. Contestants may be excused from an event only for mandatory school requirements and only with prior approval from Fair staff. Work obligations and extra-curricular activities are not excusable and may result in penalties as determined by the Appalachian Fair administration. Contestants should notify employers of these expectations prior to entering.
- 5. **Eligibility Restrictions**: A contestant is not eligible if she:
 - Has ever been married
 - Has ever had a child
 - Has competed in a previous TAF State Pageant
 - Has been found guilty of a felony.

Contestants must be of good moral character, and must be, and must have always been, female.

- 6. Attire: Contestants must wear a formal, floor-length gown. Two-piece gowns are allowed; however:
 - Wrap skirts worn over bodysuits are not permitted
 - Midriffs may be exposed
 - Bralettes are not appropriate.

Attire should be age-appropriate for contestants aged 16-20.

- 7. <u>Liability:</u> The Appalachian Fair is not responsible for any damages, injuries, or loss of property including apparel and accessories during the pageant or related activities.
- 8. **Release of Claims:** By submitting an entry, the contestant and her family waive and release any and all claims for personal injury or property damage against the Appalachian Fair, the pageant director, representatives, or sponsors arising from participation in the contest.
- Additional Rules: Additional rules established by the Tennessee Association of Fairs Pageant Committee for the Tennessee Fairest of the Fair Pageant also apply.

- Scholarship & State Competition: The winner of the Appalachian Fair's Fairest of the Fair will receive a \$2,500 scholarship, awarded the following year upon crowning her successor. Proof of school/continuing education enrollment must be submitted to the Appalachian Fair Office. She will represent the Appalachian Fair at the Tennessee Fairest of the Fair Pageant in Murfreesboro on January 15, 2027. The Fair will cover travel expenses for the winner and her chaperone.
- 2. Fair Week Benefits: The winner will receive:
 - Fair admission tickets
 - Car passes
 - Main Stage concert tickets.

Valid for the remainder of the fair week.

- State Contest Travel: All hotel and travel expenses for the winner and her chaperone, related to state competition events, will be reimbursed by the Appalachian Fair.
- State Title: The winner of the state pageant will receive the title of 'Tennessee's Fairest of the Fair' along with prizes provided by the Tennessee Association of Fairs.
