2. Contestant agrees to wear the crown and sash when on the Appalachian Fairgrounds or when representing the Appalachian Fair at community events, including but not limited to parades, etc. _____
3. Contestant agrees to participate in area local parades and events throughout the year including at Christmas Parades and 4th of July Events as requested by fair personnel. _____
4. The Tennessee Association of Fairs convention will be held in Murfreesboro, **January 15-19, 2025**. The State Fairest of the Fair contest will be held at the Embassy Suites located at 1200 Conference Center Blvd., Murfreesboro. Contestant agrees to be available that week to participate in all related events. _____
5. A state sponsored workshop will be held for the Fairest of the Fair contestants in November/December 2024 at the Embassy Suites in Murfreesboro; dates to be announced. Contestant agrees to be available to attend this event. _____
6. If the winner of the Appalachian Fair pageant wins another title during her reign, that prevents her from wearing the Appalachian Fair crown and sash, she must relinquish her title as Appalachian Fair's Fairest of the Fair and will not receive her scholarship winnings. RULES

*****MUST BE AVAILABLE THE WEEK OF THE FAIR TO FULFILL REQUESTED DUTIES*****

1. A **\$50.00 NON-REFUNDABLE ENTRY FEE IS REQUIRED FOR EACH CONTESTANT**. Contestant must be sponsored by a civic organization, business firm, or family member. Entry may be made by completing an entry form (please type) obtained from the Appalachian Fair office, downloaded from their website, by calling 423.477.3211, or through e-mail request to – appalachianfair@gmail.com. The **typed and notarized** form should be returned to the Fair Office on or before **AUGUST 8th**, with a **\$50 non-refundable entry fee**. The form may be returned to the Appalachian Fair by mail: PO Box 8218, Gray, TN 37615, by fax: 423.477.3853, e-mailed: appalachianfair@gmail.com or delivered to the Fair Office: 100 Lakeview Street, Gray, TN. If faxed or e-mailed, the \$50 fee must be paid by credit card. An online invoice payable by credit card or echeck will be sent to you via the email address provided on the application. The Appalachian Fair reserves the right to limit the number of contestants to 30, however, no entries or fees will be accepted after August 8th. Checks should be made payable to the **Appalachian Fair**. All major credit cards will be accepted.
2. Contestant **must have reached her 16th birthday, but not her 21st birthday on/or before December 31** of the year in which the contest is held and must be a resident of Tennessee. Original birth certificate must be presented at the first rehearsal.
3. Contestants will be judged on beauty, poise, and personality.
4. The contest will be held at the Appalachian Fair on Monday night, August 19th, at 7PM on the Museum Stage. **Contestant must be available to reign during the entire week of August 19th-24th, 2024**. If the winner of the Appalachian Fair Pageant wins another title during her reign that prevents her from wearing the Appalachian Fair crown and sash, she must relinquish her crown and scholarship. A contestant is allowed to miss an event due to mandatory school schedules and with the approval of the Appalachian Fair staff. Extra-curricular activities and work-related events are non-excusable and can result in penalties defined by the Appalachian Fair administration.
5. Contestant cannot qualify if she has ever been married, had a child, **competed in a prior TAF State Pageant**, or found guilty of a felony. She must be of good moral character, and is now, and has always been, a female.
6. Contestant must wear formal floor length attire. The dress may be two-piece but cannot be a wrap skirt worn over a bodysuit. Midriff may be exposed but bralettes are not appropriate. Be mindful of the age group of 16 thru 20 and dress accordingly.
7. The Appalachian Fair will not be held liable for any damages or bodily injuries that may occur to a contestant or her wearing apparel and accessories during the contest or contest activities. Also, the Appalachian Fair may not be held responsible for any lost or stolen articles during the contest or contest activities.
8. In consideration of accepting this entry the contestant and her family must waive and release any and all claims for personal injury or property damage, of whatever form and nature against the Appalachian Fair, the pageant director, a representative of above, or any named sponsor, that may arise from participation in this contest.
9. Other rules apply as set forth by the TN Association of Fairs Pageant Committee regarding the TN Association of Fairs Fairest of the Fair Winner.

AWARD

1. The young lady who receives the title of Appalachian Fair's Fairest of the Fair will receive a **\$2,500 scholarship award the following year upon crowning of the new 2025 Fairest of the Fair**. Proof of school registration must be submitted to the Appalachian Fair office. The Fairest of the Fair will represent the Appalachian Fair in Tennessee's Fairest of the Fair contest in Murfreesboro on January 17, 2025. The Appalachian Fair will pay the incurred travel expenses of the queen and her chaperone to the contest.
2. The winner will be provided with fair admission tickets, car passes, and Main Stage concert tickets for the remainder of the fair week.
3. Hotel and travel expenses incurred by the contestant and her chaperone related to all state contest events will be reimbursed by the Appalachian Fair.
4. The winner of the state contest will receive the title of 'Tennessee's Fairest of the Fair' and such prizes as approved by the Tennessee Association of Fairs.

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
